2. Review of Minutes from November 2016 Meeting

November meeting minutes were distributed via email or via download from the website. Representatives from CRSOA were mistakenly left off the minutes; minutes from November 2016 meeting were accepted as amended.

3. Brief Administrative Update—Bekah Canfield

Bekah gave a brief update reminding the membership to check the website for meeting schedules and to use the sign in sheets so the minutes remain accurate.

4. Financial Report—Chair, Cale Karrick

a. 2017 Contribution Cycle

Cale gave a brief overview of the importance of the voluntary contributions and what they have accomplished this year. 2017 invoicing has gone out. The goal for participation continues to be 80%. Last year was 56% participation.

b. 2016 YE Financial Standing: Liz Wainwright

Liz gave a brief overview of the financial standing of the Lower Columbia Region Harbor Safety Committee and went over the Statement of Activities with the membership.

5. Working Committee Reports: Committee Representatives

a. Standing Committee Reports:

- Anchorages –Jon Aschoff: Currently working on the 2 proposed Anchorages. During the last storm, Rice Island was used to great success. Port of Portland, and Millennium Bulk also have anchorages/lay berths available. The application for the 3 new stern buoys has been completed and will hopefully be installed in August.
- 2. Extreme Water Jon Gornick: Snow pack is up after a wet winter season. Watching for May-June when the snow melt flows.
- 3. Harbor Safety Plan Kate Mickelson
 - a. The current goal is to modernize the look of the Harbor Safety Plan and make the pdf searchable. Every section will be updated annually and an update is coming soon.
- 4. Make-Way USCG/Pilots: Not currently "Make way season" The cutter fleet is recapitalizing and new cutters are being built with assignments of Fast Response Cutters to Astoria and Columbia River. Also trying to get patrol boats from District for mid-river/Longview area. A reminder was made that foreign workers aboard vessels must go ashore at public access points only, as approved by CBP. There were some reports of individuals going ashore on private property.
- Outreach Kristin Meira. Some upriver interest and tribal/environmental outreach, welcome to Officer Larry Risley of the Columbia River Inter-Tribal Fisheries Enforcement! Inviting Port of Morrow.
- 6. Navigation Capt. Dan Jordan: All three NOAA Weather Buoys are currently gone and unsure of when they will be redeployed (could be May or June). The sea buoys (wave buoys) are still operational but there is no wave approaching buoy. This is the first time that all three have been lost at the same time. 2 broke loose and went adrift and one stopped working. After discussion with membership, it was agreed that NOAA will be invited to give a presentation regarding the buoys at their next availability. Bekah Canfield will coordinate.

6. CRVTSA Update, Washington Department of Ecology

A scenario workshop is being developed and the project timeline includes: January 2017 meeting that was held at the Merchants Exchange, an additional meeting scheduled in February 2017 (also hosted at the Merchants Exchange) looking at risk mitigation data and reduction in risk, draft report to Olympia by May 2017, budget recommendations to Olympia by June 30, 2017, final

report goal June 2018.

6. CRVTSA Update, Washington Department of Ecology

A draft was released at the start of the month (March 2017.) There will be a meeting of the workgroup on March 21, 2017 at the Merchants Exchange from 1-5pm to go over the draft. Scott Ferguson will be attending and available at the Industry Breakfast this month. No further updates.

7. Presentation: NVIC 1-00: Ken Lawrenson

Ken Lawrenson gave an overview of the organizational structure and formation of Harbor Safety Committees, as well as the mission and elements of a successful Harbor Safety Committee. On the matter of Incorporation, he spoke with Rajiv Khandapur, USCG and John Veentjer, Marine Exchange Puget Sound about the process. To his knowledge, the Puget Sound HSC is the only one that has actually gone through the process of incorporation. The NVIC as it is written does not address the issue of incorporation but rather charges the formation of the Harbor Safety Committee and recommendation of establishing a charter. A benefit of incorporation is recognition by State entities. He reported that the State of Washington directly recognizes the need for public comment out of the Harbor Safety Committees. Some discussion followed. Moved to move the discussion of Incorporation and potential 501(c)(3) status to the Managing Board.

8. Presentation: NOAA Update, Crescent Moegling

Crescent Moegling gave a presentation and update on the status of NOAA, specifically the buoys that are currently offline. She posted a link to the maintenance schedule, noting that of the three that are currently offline: one was due to be serviced in early May, one was due to be deployed in early May and one was due for a complete hull exchange in July 2017. She also spoke briefly about the Nav. Response Team based out of Seattle that serves both Washington and Oregon, with surveys in the Columbia River as a priority and the National Charting Plan program. NOAA updates will be posted on the LCRHSC website and sent out to membership periodically.

4th of July celebrations at Tom McCall Park were incident free. The Bluebell is underway. No collisions or allisions to report with fishing vessels. Sturgeon opening coincided with Rose Festival and Fleet Week with clear traffic for commercial vessels and Navy vessels.

5. Navigation

Low water and shoaling continue to be a factor.

6. **USCG**

2 new Coast Guard Cutters are expected in the next 4 years; adding 75 new USCG billets.

3 new stern buoys installed by October 2017: Vancouver, Prescott and Longview. Looking for a priority anchorage spot for USCG ships and a permanent location for a mooring ball for USCG patrol boats. In 2021, the region will receive 2 Fast Response Cutters with options for anchorages along the river near Astoria being explored.

2. Extreme Water

River is currently low. The end of the month is predicted as "Low water" (September 24-25).

3. Harbor Safety Plan

a. Anchorage Guidelines are being updated with collaboration from the Pilots. A draft and changes are expected at the next meeting.

4. Make-Way

Progress and collaboration with Make-Way efforts has been very successful. serving as PIO.

5. Navigation

6. **USCG**

A USCG Helo was sent to San Diego to backfill for the response efforts to recovery after Hurricanes Harvey and Irma; the river was shut down for the Eagle Creek Fire with LCDR Laura Springer

6. Presentations:

a. Port of Longview—Norman Krehbiel; Chief Executive Officer CEO of Port of Longview, Norman Krehbiel, gave a presentation about the Port highlighting the facility modernization, tonnage, and on-dock rail services offered at the Port as well as new operators leasing space.

7. CRVTSA Update, Washington Department of Ecology

The draft report has been submitted to the Department of Ecology leadership and then forwarded on to staff for comment. No changes are anticipated at this time. Timeline for submitting the report to the Governor's office as final is estimated to be well-prior to the deadline of December 15th, 2017. There are two recommendations that are being made in the report, no recommendations for legislation are currently being made.

8. New Business/Good of the Order

- Lower Columbia Improvement Plan: Dredging Strategic Plan for the next 2 years. A scoping process/public comment will be open through November 16th, 2017. More information will be made available on the LCRHSC website after the meeting.
- The Port Security Grant Program has awarded over \$100 Million nationwide, The Columbia Snake River System has received \$1.6 Million in awards. Next year, Houston and Florida might see an increase in awards following the destructive Hurricane storm season this year.
- WA Dept of Ecology has been tasked with a Rail Risk Assessment in Gray's Harbor. They will be following an IMA Step process.

1. Meeting Called to Order, Chair: Cale Karrick:

Cale called the meeting to order at 1425 and introductions of all attendees, guests and speakers were conducted. A safety briefing was conducted and all were welcomed to the meeting.

2. Review of Minutes from September 13, 2017 Meeting

Meeting minutes were approved with one correction, as mentioned in the Managing Board meeting, "IMO Safety Process" was incorrectly listed in the minutes.

3. Managing Board Update—Cale Karrick

a. Election of 2018 Officers: Update

b. Incorporation Status Update

Cale gave a brief overview of the Incorporation process to the General Membership, including the need to protect members from liability and the benefit of tax deductible contributions. Incorporation is moving forward and is anticipated to be completed in the next several months. The LCRHSC will be working with Schwabe, Williamson & Wyatt for the initial filing process. Further updates will be given at future meetings.

5. Financial Report—

a. 2017 Contribution Cycle—Cale Karrick

Cale spoke briefly on the 2018 Contribution Cycle that will begin in January 2018, highlighting the 56% current participation with a goal of 80% participation.

b. 2017 Financial Report: Liz Wainwright, Merchants Exchange

Liz gave a brief overview of the financial standing of the Lower Columbia Region Harbor Safety Committee and went over the Statement of Activities with the membership. The cost for the catered lunch in Astoria was highlighted on the Statement of Activities as well as the budget line item that allowed for Cale and Sean to attend the West Coast Harbor Safety Committee Summit in Long Beach this Fall.

The 2018 Operating Budget that was approved by the Managing Board also includes costs associated with the Incorporation process.

6. Working Committee Reports: Committee Representatives

a. Standing Committee Reports:

1. Anchorages - Capt. Jon Aschoff

November 18th will see the installation of long-awaited buoys in Vancouver, Kalama and Longview. Changes have been made in the Harbor Safety Plan.

2. Harbor Safety Plan – Kate Mickelson

- a. Anchorages Update was approved by the Managing Board, including the emergency anchorage spots by the Bar Pilots.
- 3. Make-Way USCG/Pilots

Nothing further to report.

4. **Navigation** – Capt. Dan Jordan

Crab Season opens December 1 on the Bar. There is an upcoming meeting in Astoria with representatives from the Commercial Crabber and Towboat Industry.

7. CRVTSA Update, Washington Department of Ecology

The CRVTSA Report has successfully navigated the Governor's Office. Brian Kirk is currently working on presenting the Report through to the Legislature.

8. Presentation: West Coast Harbor Safety Summit: Cale and Sean

Cale and Sean gave an overview of their time spent at the West Coast Harbor Safety Summit, held aboard the Queen Mary in Long Beach, CA. It was a very successful meeting with a wide

variety of relevant topics for discussion. While there, Cale and Sean learned that there are 4 other Harbor Safety Committees that have incorporated. Topics of discussion that came up during the Summit included: Pilotage and Autonomous vessels, the creation of a "Bunkering Best Practices" and inclusion in the pre-transfer checklist for port areas, the impact of wind energy farms in CA, and the process of navigating through a restricted fishing area.

9. New Business/Good of the Order

 Washington Dept. of Ecology: Brian Kirk and Scott Ferguson are beginning a VTSA in Gray's Harbor that will include a study of rail safety as well. This will be following the IMO Formal Safety Assessment process.

USCG:

- The 2016 Crab Season saw 3 vessels overturned or aground; USCG continues to work with Bar Pilots.
- The slated addition of 2 Fast Response Cutters to the Lower Columbia Region could also mean the addition of 176 more USCG personnel in the Astoria region.
- The summer was extremely busy for USCG personnel in the SE region. Personnel from the Lower Columbia Region were also assisting in Puerto Rico during the hurricane aftermath.
- USCG worked with the US Army Corps of Engineers to find a sunken tug near Bonneville Dam, using the Survey Boat. The tug is currently still in the channel.
